Will of Anne Brangman, widow, of Churchill, 1670

In the name of god Amen the Thirteenth day of February  
On[e] thousand Six hundred Sixtie and Eight according to the  
Computation of the Church of England I Anne Brangman  
of Churchill in the countie of Oxford widow being of perfect  
memory and remembrance praysed be god doe make & ordaine  
This my last Will and Testament in manner and forme following  
First I bequeath my Soule into the hands of Almighty god my  
Maker hoping that through the meritorious death and passion  
of Jesus Christ my only Saviour and Redeemer to regeine free  
pardon and forgivnesse of all my sins and as for my body  
to be buried in Christian buriall at the discretion of my Executrix  
Also I give unto <sup>my</sup> sonne John Brangman One shillinge  
Also I give unto my sonne Thomas Brangman One shillinge  
Also All the rest of my goods and Chattells whatsoever  
I give unto my daughter Anne Brangman upon  
Condicon that she shall pay All my debts and legacies  
And make her sole Executrix of this my last Will and  
Testament revoking all other Wills and Testaments  
In witnesse whereof I have hereunto set my hand  
and seale the day and yeare First above Written
