

**Oxfordshire History Centre, MS Wills Oxon 12/3/9****Will of Ursulaye Clapptone, widow, of Sarsden, 1628**

In the name of god Amene the xvii<sup>th</sup> daye of Februarye in the xiiij<sup>th</sup> yeare of  
The Rayne of o[u]r Sovereigne lorde James by the grace of god kyng of England  
France and Irelande deffender of the Faythe and of Scotlande the xlix<sup>th</sup> yere  
I Ursulaye Clapptone of Sarsdene in the Coun[ty] of Oxon widdowe of p[er]fecte  
minde and memorye thankes be to god, doe ordeyne Constitute & make this my laste  
will & Testament in manne[r] and Forme Folloinge that is to saye First I  
Commende ny Sowle in to the handes of almighttye god p[er]fetley belevinge to have  
forgevenes of my Synes by the passione of o[ur] Savioure Jhesus Christe And  
my Boddye to be buriede in the p[ar]ishe Churche or Churche yarde of Churche hille  
att the discession of my Executore; Imprimis I geve & bequeath unto John  
Clapptone my kynesman vinttner in the olde Bayllie in Londone vi<sup>s</sup> viij<sup>d</sup> And to  
my god daughter Ursulaye harise I geve & bequeathe x<sup>s</sup> It[e]m I geve & bequeathe  
to Anthoney Clapptone my Joynde beddsted & vi<sup>s</sup> viij<sup>d</sup> It[e]m I geve & bequeathe unto  
Alice Clapptone x<sup>s</sup> It[e]m I geve & bequeathe to William Flecher the sonne of Thomas  
and Elizabeth Flechere nowe beinge brought up w[i]<sup>th</sup> my sonne John Clapptone  
xxx<sup>s</sup> It[e]m I geve to Ursulaye Flecher xiiij<sup>s</sup> iiij<sup>d</sup> To the reste of Thomas Flecher  
his children beinge sixe in number I bequeather to everye one of them vj<sup>s</sup> viij<sup>d</sup> a  
peece It[e]m I geive unto my Daughter Elizabethe Flechere my Fether bedde one  
bowlster one pillowe one pare of Blanketes ~~one kettell~~ & my Coffe in the  
Madenes Chamber under the window It[e]m I geive & bequeathe to my Daughter  
Amei Ameresdene my beste Coverlete & my beste peticoote & seconde gowne and  
My Coffe wherin I laye my linene I geive to John Halle the sonne of my saide  
Daughter xiiij s iiij d & to Margaret hall xiijs iiijd It[e]m I geive & bequeathe unto the tow youngest Childrene  
of her my saide Daughter Amei vi<sup>s</sup> viij<sup>d</sup> a peece It[e]m I geibe & bequeathe  
To M<sup>r</sup> Glynne Vikere of Churche hille iijs iiij<sup>d</sup> All the reste of my Goodes &  
Cattel moveable and unmoveable ungiven & unbequeather whatsoever I  
geive and bequeather unto John Clapptone my welbeloved sonne whom I make  
my wholl Executore to see my Debtes payde legacies discharged & y Bodye  
honestley brought to the earthe And This I bide you all hartily farewell

put to my hande & Sealle the daye and the yeare a bove written
