Will of John Evans, of Churchill, 1559

Testam[en]t of Johne Evans

Of Churchill

In the name of god am[en] the xxi<sup>th</sup> daye of maye ano dom[ini] 1559 I  
John Evans Sicke in bodie but p[er]fett of remebrain[c]e do  
make my last will and testame[n]t as folowith fyrst I  
bequeathe my soule to god and my bodie to be buried  
in the Churche yard of or in christio[n] buriall I geve  
and bequeathe to william Evans my oldest sonne my hou  
se in churchill withall the comoditeis belonging  
to the same after the decease of my wiffe the best  
pott and the best panns and a tablebord and I will  
if my sonne Will[ia]m fortune to die without issue of  
his bodie lawfully [word crossed ou] the[n] I will the sayd house  
to remayne to Thomas my sonne and so from one to  
another so long as any do remayne Item to Jonas  
my second pott a chaffer dyshe ij platters a whinged dyshe  
and a laver Tt[e]m to Jane my daughter the best basin  
ij platters a whinged dyshe Item All the rest of my goods  
not goven nor bequeathed I geve and bequeathe to Amy  
my wiffe whome I make my full executrix of my will  
and testame[n]t Thes[e] being wittnesses John Jever Morris  
mollington John Avis with others
