*You shall swear that you believe the Will hereunto annexed to be the true and last Will and Testament of **John Hacker Senior of Churchill** deceased and that you will well and truly perform the same by the payment of his debts and the Legacies in the Will given and bequeathed so farr as his Goods and Chattles will thereunto extend and the Law requirerth. And that ~~you will exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the Registry of Archdeacons Court of Oxford is~~ ^{this Inventory} a true and perfect Inventory of all and Singular the Goods Chattels ad Credits of the said deceased that ^{are} ~~shall~~ come to your hands possession or knowledge and make your Accounts when you shall be thereunto lawfully required so help you God and by the holy contents of this Book.*
