Will of Anne Hewes, of Sarsden, 1619

In the name of god Ame[n]: I Anne Hewes of Sarsden  
in the county Oxon, beinge sicke in Body but  
(god be prayesd) of good & p[er]fect memory, Doe  
make this my last will & testament in mann[er]  
& forme followinge: first I bequeath my soule  
into the hande of almighty god, hopinge by  
the will of Jesus Christe my only savior &  
redeem[er] to obtayne et[er]nall Salvatio[n] . my body I  
bequeath to the earthe whe[n]soev[er] it shall please  
god to call for it: my worldly goods I dispose  
as followeth. I give unto Anne Bennett  
one payr[e] of shetts & one towell: I give my  
sis[t]er Elizabeth Hyett one Bushell of Barley  
all the rest of my goods moveable and un  
moveable, my debtes being payd, & fune[r]all  
discharged, I give unto Johan Bennett who  
I doe make my whole, & lawfull executrix  
the tennth Day of June the yeare of o[ur] lord  
god one thousand sixe hundred & eyghteene.

*Probate 8<sup>th</sup> April 1619 Dr Barker granted letters of Administration to Thomas Bennett because nominated executrix was a minor.*
