Will of James Hewes, of Sarsden, 1613

In the name of god amen : the ninth day of March
in the yeare of o[u]r lord god: 1612: I James hewes
of Sarsden in the county oxon being sicke in
body, but god be than[ked]of good & p[er]fect
rememberance, doe make my last will &
testament in mann^{er} as followeth : First I
bequeath my soule into the hands of the
allmighty thorne the m[er]itoris sacrifice of Jesu
Christe: & my body to the earth whensoever it shall
please god to call for it / my worldly goods I
thus dispose : I give unto John Bennet my wifes
first sonn, all my wearing cloathes & one copper
Item I give unto Anne Bennet,& unto Robert Bennet
unto eache of them one brasse pott, & one copper. Item I
give unto Johan Bennet my wifes fifth daughter
lykewyse one copp^{er},& one brasse pott,& my best bedd
w[i]th the furniture: all w[i]th fer^sall gifte & legacies
my will is shallbe delyv[e]ed unto them, or unto the
surviver, or survivors of the iii diath aft[er] the
diseceasse of my wife ,& not before/ The rest of my
goodes moveable, & unmoveable, [my debts payde &
fun[er]all discharged I give unto Anne my wife
whoe I make my whole executrix//
