## Will of John Jevys, of Churchill, 1560

Testamenum Johanis Jevys p[ar]ochie de Churchill

In the name of god ame[n] the xv<sup>th</sup> daye of Aprell anno d[o]mini 1560 I  
John Jevys of Churchill beinge sicke of bodie but hole of mynde  
p[er]fett of remembrance do ordayne and make this my present  
last will in man[ner] and forme folowenge First I bequethe my soule  
to god my maker and redemer and my bodie to be buried in the  
p[ar]ishe church yard of Churchill I bequeathe to Vanse my sonne aft[er]  
the decease of his mother the lease of my house a carte a plow  
and ij horses w[i]th all things belonging there in the filds before  
rehersted one Coffe a Silver spone I bequeth to mar  
garett Jevys my daughter one heiffar of ij yeres of age  
and to be delyved this time ij yeres folowinge one brasse pa[n]e  
one table boarde It[e]m I bequethe to Alys my daughter a  
heifer that her mother shall breede for her and the heifer  
Shalbe ij yere of age and to be delyved this time iiij yeres  
and the biggest brasse pane and a tabull bord It[e]m I be  
quethe to Christian my daughter a heyfor of ij yere age  
that her mother shall bred for her and to be delyved her  
this time vi yeres & a Cowbord a cowthron a table bord  
It[e]m I will that my wiffe shall bryde for my ij younger  
children Elisab[et]h and Jone to ev[er]y of them a heiffer of ij  
yere of age and to be delyved one this time viij yeres  
the other this time x yeres All the rest of my goods not be  
quethede I geve and bequeth to Margery my wiffe whom  
I ordayne and make my true and lawfull executrix  
to kepe and bringe up my children and to dispose for my childr[en]  
Sowle as she shall think good and these beinge wyttnes
