Will of William Judge, husbandman of Churchill, 1568

Testament[u]m Will[ia]m Judge de Churche hylle

In the name of god amen the xth of Februarye beyng in the tenthe yere of the reyne of our Soferayne ladie Elizabeth the etc., I Wyllyam Judge of Churchyll in the Countye of oxford husbandman beyng sycke in body and whole in mynde and parfytt remembrance doo this make my last Wyll and Testamente in maner and forme following Fyrst I bequethe my sowle unto allmyghtye god and my body to be buried in the churche yarde of Churchyll aforesaid Fyrst I gyve and bequethe to Nicholas [?]ecles one heyfer two sheepe and halfe one sheepe and Wyntering for xvj sheepe Allso I gyve to the said Nicholas two bushells of wheate and two bushells of malte and one lande of wheate next to the best and one lande of barley nexte to the best in lyke maner and three pecises of pewter and a table boarde the w[hi]cth standyth on the benche Allso I gyve to bartlemewe my carte my plough and my geres thereunto belonging & harrowes saving that my daughter shall have theme to doo her busynesse duringe her tyme in the house Allso he shall have one kever and one ioyned table Allso I gyve to John Whyting one hogge And to John Wykyn one lambe And to John Hacker one ewe and her lambe to be delyvered at Whytsontyde next followinge All the rest of my goodes movable and unmoveable I gyve to Frideswide my daughter whom I make my whole executrix to see this my last Wyll and Testament p[er]formed mye dettes payed my buryall discharged These bearinge Wytnesse Richard Maunder Richard Boxe Wyllyam byrrge and the parson of Sarsden whom I make my overseere to this my last Wyll and Testament
