Testatment John Tappane of Churchill In the name of god amen the Thirtieth day of May in the ye[a]re of o[ur] lord God 1558 I John Tappane of Churchill beying sick in bodie & p[er]fit of memorie doe make my will & tes[ta]ment in man[ne]r & form following First I bequeath my soule to almyghtie god my bodie to be buried in the church yard of Churchill Item to mother church of oxon £5 to my daughter Elizab[e]th vj<sup>1</sup> beside her owne proper goods also I bequeath to Clem[en]t my sonne Tene pounds & haffe the tymber in the (illegible) Also the pewter pott a pair corder[n] every yeare A lambe to brede uppe I doe bequeath to Joanne my daughter vj<sup>1</sup> xiij<sup>s</sup> iiij<sup>d</sup> A small shete & A candil? (illegible) if it shall please god to call enve of the aforesaid children to his mercie that then the parte or p[ar]tes shall remayne to the longer lyver of them also I doe make my trew & lawfull executor Alice my wiffe & Robert my sonne & the saide Robert to have haffe my goodes moveable & immoveable w[i]thout the house and if aforesaid Alice doe marrie or doe depart out of this world then it is my will that the saide Alice shall have the same...... Robert cart plough & all things app[er]tayning to the same
