Will of Jane Tappine, widdow, of Churchill, 1677

In the name of God Amen I Jane Tappine of Churchill in the County of Oxford widdowe beinge in good health & of sounde & perfecte minde & memorie praise be therefore given to Allmightey God doe make & ordaine this my p[re]ente last will & testament in manner & forme followinge makeing void & null all former wills by me made (That is say) First & principalley I comend my Soule into the handes of Allmightey God hoppinge it through the Merites death & passion of my Saveyour Jesus Christ to have full & free pardon & forgivnes of All my Sinns & to inherite everlastinge life, & my body I committe to be decentley buryed att t[he] discression of my Execut[or] here after named & as touchinge of t[he] disposing of my temporall estate as itt hath pleased God to bestowe upon me I give & disposse them as followeth

First I will that my debtes & funeral charges shalbe paid & discharged, Item I give & bequeath unto Gyles Tappine my eldest Sonn Five pounds to be payed w[i]thin one yeare after my decease Item I give unto my daughter Rebeckah One shillinge to be paid w[ith]in One yeare after my decease Item I give & bequeath unto Benjamin Tappine my uniest Sonn all my Croppe & stocke all my goodes & Chattles & Cattle of what sorte soever the Croppe upon t[he] ground & in the Barnes or else where & whoyme I make my whole & Sole Execut[or] of this my will In witness whereof I have here unto sett my hande & seale this Ninth day of November in the yeare of o[ur] Lord One thousand six hundred & Seaventy Sealed & deliverd In the p[re]sence of The m[a]rke of Jane Tappine
